Tentative Schedule

While your sailing adventure will generally follow our Sample Daily Agenda and Tentative Itinerary, please note that every day's activities are subject to change, primarily due to weather conditions. The itinerary has built-in flexibility to ensure we can tailor the experience to everyone's preferences! For example, if a snorkel trip is planned, guests always have the option to relax comfortably on the catamaran or lounge on a beautiful, nearby beach instead!

Most evenings will be spent at anchor, and each anchorage will present unique features and exciting opportunities for exploration. Activities in these beautiful spots could include sunset beach walks, snorkeling, fishing, exploring island trails, and interacting with local wildlife, such as the friendly stingrays! And of course, we will seek out the famously fun island bars found throughout the cays—perfect spots to hop ashore, grab a frosty drink, enjoy some music, and soak up that true Bahamian atmosphere!

January 17th – Arrival Day

Arrive in Marsh Harbour Abaco and take a 15-minute taxi to Jib Room and Marsh Harbour Marina to board our vessel. We will give you a brief boat tour and let you have time to settle into your cabins. There will be snacks onboard, but lunch is on your own since everyone is arriving at different times. There will also be time for everyone to venture to the liquor store to buy their own provisions if desired. We will have reservations for a group dinner ashore!

January 18th – Great Guana Cay

Our adventure begins with a brief orientation at 9:00 am. We'll get everyone familiar with essential boat systems, review safety procedures, and go over our intended itinerary for the week before getting underway.

Once we set sail, you can immediately relax and take in the stunning views of the Sea of Abaco. On our route to Great Guana Cay, we'll make an optional stop to explore a true hidden gem: one of the largest and least-traveled sandbars in Abaco.

The rest of the day is dedicated to experiencing the famous Sunday Funday on Guana Cay, which offers an abundance of fun. You can choose to snorkel the vibrant offshore reef, walk along the infamously long Atlantic side beach, or join the legendary island party at Nipper's Beach Bar & Grill. We'll end the day enjoying the best sunset in Abaco, seen from the laid-back, waterfront setting of Grabber's Bar & Grill.

January 19th – Tahiti Beach & Tilloo Cay

Tahiti Beach is a stunning, secluded slice of paradise located on the southern tip of Elbow Cay. It is famous for its soft white sand bar that stretches far out into the shallow, crystal-clear turquoise water during low tide, creating a unique and picturesque walking experience. Lined with swaying coconut trees, it offers a serene and tranquil atmosphere perfect for swimming, beachcombing for shells and sea glass, and simply relaxing.

After spending the afternoon at Tahiti Beach, we will sail to Tilloo Cay. This island is an almost completely uninhabited sanctuary, making it one of our most relaxing and beautiful stops. Tilloo Cay features the serene Tilloo Pond, a known haven for dozens of sea turtles, as well as a scenic walking trail that offers stunning views atop the island. We especially love Tilloo Cay for its secluded beach, and we plan to enjoy a memorable beach bonfire on this evening!

January 20th – Little Harbour

Little Harbour is a unique, and very protected, harbour known for its Bahamian charm and as a historic artists' colony. It is home to the famous Pete's Pub & Gallery, a quintessential open-air, beachside bar and restaurant with a sand floor. Pete's is not just a pub; it's part of the enduring legacy of the Johnston family, who settled here in the 1950s and established the only working bronze sculpture foundry in the Bahamas.

Visiting Little Harbour offers an unforgettable experience: enjoying fresh Bahamian food and the signature "Blaster" rum punch at the pub, exploring the on-site art gallery, and soaking up the laid-back, creative atmosphere of this off-the-grid gem. *This night is a planned dinner ashore to enjoy the local cuisine!*

En route to Little Harbour, and weather permitting, we will make a stop at Sandy Cay to experience one of Abacos' most beautiful and vibrant reefs! This is an unparalleled opportunity to snorkel in an underwater world bursting with marine life and color.

January 21st – Hope Town

Hope Town is one of the most picturesque and charming settlements in the Abaco Islands, located on Elbow Cay.

It is most famous for the iconic Elbow Reef Lighthouse, a red-and-white striped landmark that is one of the last manually operated, kerosene-fueled lighthouses in the world. The village itself features narrow, pedestrian-friendly streets lined with colorful, colonial-style cottages, and is a popular destination for boating, relaxing, shopping, and exploring its rich Loyalist history. The town offers one of Abacos most scenic beaches you can walk for miles, and easy access to excellent snorkeling and dining.

January 22nd – Man O War Cay

We will set sail to visit Man O War Cay for the day, exploring town and yet another picturesque shoreline. Man-O-War Cay is a peaceful, historically preserved, renowned as the boat-building capital of The Bahamas, and deeply traditional island in the Abaco chain.

After enjoying the day on Man-O-War, we will head back to our marina slip on Marsh Harbour for our last dinner on shore together.

January 23rd – Departure Day

Your final morning onboard, relax and enjoy breakfast at your leisure and maybe a final stroll around the main island. We will help schedule your taxi to the airport to make your travel day as relaxed as possible.

Onboard Provisions

Enjoy unparalleled views for every meal!

Your floating home for the week will be thoughtfully stocked with all the standard provisions needed to create delicious, family-style meals that suit everyone's dietary needs. We embrace a spirit of teamwork and shared enjoyment on board: everyone will take turns preparing our evening dinners together. Most breakfasts and lunches will be left for individuals to prepare at their leisure.

Prior to the trip, we will reach out to all guests to gather detailed information about dietary needs and preferences, allowing us to create a menu that ensures everyone is catered to. Dinner is a fun, group activity, and we welcome and encourage everyone to contribute and share a favorite meal they are excited to prepare for the crew. Naturally, the cleanup of the galley is also a shared responsibility, ensuring our floating home stays tidy and enjoyable for all.

While we encourage the group dining experience, there will be frequent opportunities throughout the week to step ashore. Guests may choose to enjoy a more intimate dining experience at local restaurants or grab lunch and drinks at island bars.

Please note: *The meals for the first and last nights, which are spent staying on the dock, as well as one more night while visiting other islands, will be enjoyed at local restaurants onshore and are not covered in the trip costs.*
